Attractions

Government House 4907 Dewdney Avenue

At Government House, travel all the way back to Regina's Victorian past. Our Provincial Heritage Property and National Historic Site is bursting with over 125 years' worth of stories to tell! Step into 1905, and explore the museum, art gallery, and educational centre within for FREE. Bring the little ones down to the Once Upon a Time Room for some make believe fun and hands on learning! Outdoors, enjoy the beautiful Edwardian Gardens surrounding the building - 8.5 acres of grass, trees, and flowers that make an idyllic setting for a picturesque picnic, dog walk, or even a game of Frisbee. With daily tours and activities to take part in, every day at Government House is a new adventure!

Regina Farmers' Market City Square Plaza - 2220 12th Avenue

Regina Farmers' Market, where everything is made, baked, grown, or designed in Saskatchewan.

Legislative Building 2405 Legislative Drive

Known as the marble palace, the Saskatchewan Legislative Building is one of the largest legislative building in Canada and features 34 different types of marble from around the world. The exterior is elaborately decorated with intricate carvings of lions, gargoyles and chains of grain and fruit. The Legislative Building overlooks beautiful Wascana Lake in Wascana Centre. Tours of the Saskatchewan Legislative Building are available seven days a week.

Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame 2205 Victoria Avenue

Located in the heart of downtown Regina, the Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame was established to honour outstanding Saskatchewan athletes, championship teams and sport builders as well as preserve the history of Saskatchewan sport. Displays include portraits and citations of inductees, sports memorabilia and interactive elements.

RCMP Heritage Centre 5907 Dewdney Avenue

Discover the Real Stories of the Red Serge. The RCMP Heritage Centre is located where the tradition began, at the RCMP Academy, 'Depot' Division in Regina, Saskatchewan. Depot has trained every RCMP 'cadet' since it was established in 1885; it's no wonder Regina is often referred to as Home of the RCMP. Take a tour of historic Depot and take in the Sergeant Major's Parade. Tour the Heritage Centre and discover real stories about Mounties in red serge through stimulating galleries and exhibits that are filled with artifacts using static displays, multimedia technologies, virtual reality and augmented reality. All ages are sure to enjoy.

Royal Saskatchewan Museum 2455 Albert Street

Journey through millions of years of Saskatchewan's geological and natural history. Examine the fossil remains of long-extinct creatures and learn about the animals, insects and plants that live here today. Engage with the province's First Nations cultures and test your understanding of sustainability and our ecological footprint. No visit is complete until you meet Megamunch the robotic T. Rex. Open 9:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. Admission is by donation.

Saskatchewan Science Centre 2903 Powerhouse Drive

With more than 180 hands-on exhibits, stage shows, and extra activities all the time, the Saskatchewan Science Centre always has something fun to see, do, or explore. Make the experience complete by adding a movie at their 3D IMAX 15/70mm film theatre!
