This individual will play a key leadership role in delivering on-court training, talent identification, and aligning regional programs with the national team's high-performance objectives and long-term strategic plan.

Core Responsibilities:

- 1. Athlete Development & Training
 - Lead high-quality, intentional training sessions for national team athletes and prospective athletes within the assigned region, aligned with the Team Canada Winning Style of Play.
 - Implement regional training periods as outlined by the national team periodized plan.
 - Collaborate with national team staff to design and support Individual Performance Plans (IPPs) for athletes under your guidance.

2. Program Development

- Work in partnership with Volleyball Canada staff to establish and grow the Regional Development Centre as a key pillar of the national high-performance system for sitting volleyball.
- Secure and manage access to appropriate training facilities to meet RDC goals.
- Assist in the recruitment and integration of new training partners, including athletes with and without impairments, to enhance the training environment.
- 3. Talent Identification & Recruitment
 - Actively scout, evaluate, and engage emerging athletes with the potential to progress to national team levels.
 - Provide regular feedback to national team coaches regarding athlete progression and future potential.

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4. Collaboration & Communication

- Serve as a key liaison between regional athletes, community partners, and the national team program.
- Contribute to a culture of excellence, inclusivity, and athlete well-being within the RDC.
- Support promotional efforts to raise awareness and visibility of sitting volleyball in your region.

Qualifications and Skills

- Education:
 - Bachelor's degree in sport management, kinesiology, recreation, or a related field. Equivalent experience will be considered.
 - Preferred National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) Advanced Development Coach Certification, Performance Coach Certification would be an asset.
