MEN'S PROGRAM UPDATE

- December training in Gatineau just around the corner
 - o 16 players invited
 - o 1st training session on December 27. Departure for Vancouver on January 5
- TJ Sanders cancelled his contract in Poland
 - Currently in Calgary consulting a specialist. He is also followed by Tracy and Mike
 Wante to play in Vanagunar and part summar in Talwa
 - Wants to play in Vancouver and next summer in Tokyo
- OTP review meeting held on November 25. Awaiting funding announcement in January

WOMEN'S PROGRAM UPDATE

- Preparation for December training in Georgia getting closer. Same timeline as the Men
- Women's debrief postponed

- Will take place late January/early February
- Meeting with Tom in Calgary on December 14 will take place as planned (with Mark, Kerry and Julien)
- 2020 NEP (National Excellence program) identification is underway
 - Shannon is currently on a cross-Canada tour running ID camps/clinics in different provinces
 - Targeted athletes are to be born in 2003, 2004 and 2005
 - 16 athletes will be pre-selected" around February 2020. Invitations will follow athlete selection in March
 - Cost to each athletes participating will be \$6000
 - The Program will run from September to December 2020
 - Shannon's presentation at the Technical Summit last week is attached.

INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Men's Continental Olympic Qualification Tournament Planning is going well for this event on Jan 10-12, 2020 at the Pacific Coliseum in Vancouver. We have obtained good hotel and meal rates at the Sandman downtown.

We have submitted a supplemental Hosting Grant application for \$200,000 to Sport Canada for this event and we have informally been informed that we should be good for at least \$150,000. The City of Vancouver has confirmed \$100,000 in cash plus another \$50,000 in VIK contributions, and the Province of BC has confirmed \$50,000.

Volleyball BC has taken the lead on a coaching and a referee clinic in parallel with the event, plus a Smashball event.

Men's Nations League

We have announced Calgary as the Host City for Men's VNL on June 19-21, 2020 at Winsport Arena. We had an inspection visit with the FIVB and IMG in late October which went well. Tourism Calgary has agreed to be a partner in the event and assume shared financial responsibility as well as contributing financially to it. We have hosting grant applications in with Sport Canada and the Province of AB.

We also plan to have the VC Annual Convention is association with the Men's VNL in Calgary.

Women's Nations League

We have announced Ottawa as the Host City for Women's VNL on June 2-4, 2020 at TD Place Arena. OSEG and OVA Region 6 have once again agreed to be a partners in the event. We have hosting grant applications in with Sport Canada and the Province of ON, and the City of Ottawa has confirmed their financial commitment to the event.

1. NORCECA U20/U21 Continental Championships

NORCECA has agreed with our proposal to host the Girls' U20 Continental Championships on May 12-16 and the Mens' U21 Continental Championships on May 15-19, both in Edmonton in conjunction with the Nationals. These are planned to each be 8 team tournaments, and we will have 2 competition courts at the Edmonton Expo Center – the feature court in Hall D while another court in Hall H. The teams will all stay, eat and train at MacEwan University. Each tournament will qualify 2 teams for the World Championships in 2021.

REFEREE DEVELOPMENT / LTRD

• Domestic High Performance Referee Development

- Conducted a theoretical development clinic for six candidates in Calgary from November 28 – December 1
- Candidates will now focus on practical growth with the first eligible opportunity to be assessed in May of 2021

International Referee Development

- Two referees attended the Volleyball candidate course in Santa Domingo (November 8 15)
 - Both were successful in completing the course requirements and finished in the top of their class
- Two referee attended the Beach candidate course in Santa Domingo (November 18 25)
 - Both were successful in completing the course requirements

• 2020 National Championships

- Finalized base numbers of participation from each of the provinces
- Working on confirming referee participants by name to further the logistical planning requirements of the event(s)
- Agreed with our colleagues in the United States to have 25 referees join us in Edmonton as a means of continuing to grow cross border relations and overall referee development

LTRD Platform

- Survey of referee membership on Gender Equity and perception of the referee environment was completed mid-November
- A Gender Equity symposium focusing on referees will be conducted in Toronto on January 17 – 19, 2020
- o Ideal goal is to have participation from each of the PTAs

• National Referee Chair Transition

- I met with Scott Borys and Scott McLean at the end of December to start the transition process
- Future meetings (in person and via electronic mediums) will continue on a regular schedule going forward

Communications

As reported earlier this year, it has been a busy 2019 overall for Volleyball Canada's events, programs and national teams. Communications efforts to support these activities are constant and always changing with the organization's needs and resources available.



As Canada is hosting the men's Olympic qualifier, this late fall/early winter has been focused on planning and supporting marketing efforts for the event in early January.

Overall, key growth areas are still social media (Instagram in particular) and this

year, web cast expansion with more VC and international events available to Canadian fans than in any other year. Effort has been placed on making national events available through our YouTube page whenever possible, and international events through CBC when rights permit.

Key highlights were VNL on CBC (as well as some full network coverage) and the Beach Volleyball World Championship gold medal match live online on CBC and tape delayed on the full network. This is the first time in recent years that beach has been available via CBC (since the Olympics in 2016). Although we have not seen audience numbers for this year to date, the feedback from the CBC has been positive in general about the traffic to the volleyball web casts. A planned meeting this month (Dec. 2019) will help plan for 2020 CBC coverage and promotional support for volleyball's web casts.

Event support

As in recent years, communications (Jackie Skender and Courtney Killion) has fully supported our hosted events including consulting and assisting with Nationals, NORCECA events (in Quebec and Manitoba), Volleyball Nations League, etc, in person and many more events remotely. It would be great to be able to give full communications support to more of our events but human resources are limited.

New this year, Courtney Killion attended the Parapan Am Games (funded by the CPC) as a media attaché to support sitting volleyball. It's hoped this will continue through to the Paralympics in Tokyo, pending qualification of Canadian sitting volleyball team (s). In 2020, volleyball has secured a mission staff position (funded by the COC) for Jackie Skender to represent volleyball at the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo.

Priority events for 2020 include the Men's Tokyo Olympic Qualification Tournament in January, the sitting volleyball women's Paralympic Qualification Tournament in Feb., Nationals and related international events in May, Women's and Men's VNL in June and the Olympic and Paralympic Games in the summer of 2020.
