4. 2027 VC Beach Carding Policy

Under the VC Beach Athlete Agreements, the VC Beach Carding Policy must be published eight months before the end of the year (By April 30th each year).

The following highlights of the **2027 VC Beach Carding Policy** have been approved by Sport Canada (The full 2027 VC Beach Carding Policy will be published online before April 30, 2026). Please refer to the published policy for further details and specifics.

3. Number of Cards Available and Distribution

There is a limit on the number of Cards available to the Beach Volleyball program. Currently, the quota is 20 senior cards or the equivalent of \$522,000.

3.1 Carding quotas per gender

The maximum amount and minimum number of cards will be distributed as follows to each gender:

Gender	Senior Card (SR1/SR2 and SR) Maximum amount	Development Cards (D) Minimum amount
Male	\$208,800	\$52,200
Female	\$208,800	\$52,200

3.2 Principles for the allocation of cards per gender

A minimum of 4 months of carding may be allocated to an athlete.

Carding support will be allocated in monthly payments equivalent to the card level, i.e.: SR1, SR2 and SR cards are worth **\$2,175/month** while D cards are worth **\$1,305/month**.

4. Senior International Criteria (SR1/SR2 - \$2,175/month)

SR1/SR2 cards are T2W cards (The highest level of carding)

- Criteria: Athletes who placed in the top 8 and top ½ at the 2025 FIVB World Championships will be SR2 carded in 2027, provided they meet the minimum eligibility requirements described in point 2.

Athletes that qualify for carding under the Senior International criteria are eligible for two years of AAP support, with the card for the first year referred to as an SR1 Card and the card for the second year referred to as an SR2 Card.

4.1 Senior National Criteria (SR - \$2,175/month)

Once an athlete reaches the FIVB post-U21 age category, he/she may be carded at the Senior Card level (SR) for a maximum of five (5) years. In order to be recommended at Senior Carded for additional years, the athlete must demonstrate continued progress towards Senior International Card status results and must be recommended by Volleyball Canada.

4.1.1 Volleyball Canada T2W Carding Criteria (SR T2W)

- Must meet the minimum eligibility requirements described in point 2.

- Must achieve a minimum total of **three (3) of the following results between January 1, 2026 and December 31, 2026:**
 - 5th place finishes at 2026 Volleyball World Elite events or
 - 2nd place finishes at a 2026 Volleyball World Challenge events or
 - For example, two 5th place finishes in a Volleyball World Elite event and one 2nd place in a Volleyball World Challenge event

4.1.2 Volleyball Canada L2W Performance Carding Criteria (SR L2W)

- Must meet the minimum eligibility requirements described in point 2.
- Must achieve a minimum total of **three (3) of the following results between January 1, 2026 and December 31, 2026:**
 - 9th place finishes at 2026 Volleyball World Elite events or
 - 5th place finishes at a 2026 Volleyball World Challenge event
 - For example, two 9th place finishes in a Volleyball World Elite event and one 5th place in a Volleyball World Challenge event

4.1.3 Volleyball Canada T2C Performance Carding Criteria (SR T2C P or D T2C P)

- Must meet the minimum eligibility requirements described in point 2.
- Must achieve a minimum total of **three (3) of the following results between January 1, 2026 and December 31, 2026:**
 - 17th place finish at the 2026 World Championships
 - 13th place finishes at 2026 Volleyball World Elite events or
 - 9th place finishes at a 2026 Volleyball World Challenge events or
 - For example, two 13th place finishes in a Volleyball World Elite event and one 9th place in a Volleyball World Challenge event
 - Athletes will receive 8 months if they train remotely in camps based format or 12 months if centralized with Next Gen Program of SR level carding
 - Athletes will receive 2 years maximum of SR carding with the same partner, then D carding in subsequent years if still with the same partner and SR L2W or SR T2W results are not achieved

Sport Canada Cards

SR1/SR1 = Senior International Carding \$2,175/Month (SR1 = Year 1 & SR2 = Year 2) + Tuition Support

SR = Senior Carding \$2,175/Month + Tuition Support

D = Developmental Carding \$1,305/Month + Tuition Support

5. VC Beach Internal Nominating Procedures for Major Games

Volleyball Canada will publish the Internal Nominating Procedure (INP) at least 8 months in advance of Major Games.

6. Athlete Health

Canadian Athlete Insurance Program (CAIP)

Volleyball Canada purchases CAIP medical insurance (<http://mkirsch.ca/>) for every athlete that represents Volleyball Canada Internationally (NORCECA, FIVB, FISU plus others). Volleyball Canada spends in excess of **\$5,000** annually for this coverage.

Integrated Support Team (IST)

The VC Beach National Team Integrated Support Team (IST) is composed of Coaching and Technical Leadership experts as well as Sport Science and Sport Medicine professionals. The purpose of the integrated support team is to provide “Integrated” support services (E.g., Coaching, Medical, Mental Performance, Strength and Conditioning, Nutrition and Performance Analysis services) to Beach National Team Athletes. Services are provided based on the National Team Status and by Targeted Group (2028) and Next Gen (2028/2032).

Medical Assessments and Physical Testing

National Team Athletes (Senior and Next Gen) will receive a medical assessment in January each year. Summer Program Athletes will receive a medical assessment in May each year on a case-by-case basis. Physical Testing will happen multiple times throughout the year strategically based on the athletes’ Yearly Training Plan (YTP).

7. Travel Guidelines for International Events

Booking Flights, Hotel and Local Transportation

Beach players representing Canada athletes must book and purchase their own flights, hotel and local transportation to events. Once an athlete has purchased their flights, they need to email their travel itinerary to the Beach Operations Manager (Ryan Aktari, raktari@volleyball.ca) so their travel itinerary can be forwarded to the Tournament Promoters. On the Volleyball World Beach Pro Tour, Main Draw teams are guaranteed free local transportation if their itinerary is communicated in advance. Qualification teams are not guaranteed local transportation from the Tournament Promoter, but some may provide this service either for a fee or for free. At NORECCA events local transportation is organized by the tournament promoter on the Thursday before the tournament but it can be very inconvenient (Long wait times) and is sometimes unreliable.

8. VC Beach Selection Camps and Trials Dates

VC Beach Selection Camps and Trials (NORCECA, FIVB Age Group U18/U21, FISU...etc.) dates can be found on the VC Website and will be communicated via email when they are confirmed. Online registration will be used for all Selection Camps and Trials Tournaments.

9. Volleyball World Beach Pro Tour – VC Registration and Withdraw Policies

- Canadian teams must register via email with the VC Beach Operations Manager (Ryan Aktari, raktari@volleyball.ca) on or in advance of **-38 days** before an FIVB event. There is no Country Quota Playoff for Elite and Challenge events. Please note that both players must be copied on any email requesting registration for any FIVB event.
- VC will attempt to register a team between **-37 days** until the FIVB registration system closes; however, registration is not guaranteed. If registration is successful, VC reserves the right to issue a **\$250 CAD** late registration fine per player. Payment must be made within seven days of registration; otherwise, the team will be withdrawn from the event.
- Teams can withdraw from an FIVB event without a medical note before **-28 days FIVB Confirmed Entry Deadline**. After **-28 days** a medical note is required to withdraw without an FIVB fine. After **-21 days** both a medical note and travel proof are required to avoid an FIVB fine.

- VC Late Withdrawal Policy: If a Canadian team receives an FIVB fine for late withdrawal then each player on that team will be fined **\$250 CAD** by Volleyball Canada. If withdrawal is due to injury, the player will have to present a doctor's note and proof of purchasing a flight ticket (If after -21 days) to the VC Beach Operations Manager (Ryan Aktari, raktari@volleyball.ca).

VC Beach FIVB Wild Card Application Policy

Volleyball Canada will apply for an FIVB Wild Card (Both a Main Draw Wild Card and a Qualification Wild Card) for each Volleyball World event. Each VC FIVB Wild Card Application will have **one** Canadian team listed. The FIVB selects the FIVB Wild Cards so VC's choices may not be followed by the FIVB.

VC will always list the teams in the order of their FIVB Entry Points (**Best 3 of 4 in the last 365 days**) for Beach Pro Tour Events or the FIVB World Ranking Points for the Beach Pro Tour Finals on the FIVB Wild Card Application. For the FIVB Main Draw Wild Card Application, VC will predict the highest Canadian team not in the main draw of the upcoming event. This is not an exact science because the Wild Card Application must be in before -35 days and the confirmed team list for an event comes out at -28 days. For the FIVB Qualification Wild Card Application, VC will predict the highest Canadian team not in the qualification of the upcoming event.

Once a Canadian team is awarded an FIVB Main Draw Wild Card in the 2026 season, they will not be part of a VC FIVB Main Draw Wild Card Application again in the same season. Once a Canadian team is awarded an FIVB Qualification Wild Card in the 2026 season they will not be part of a VC FIVB Qualification Wild Card Application again in the same season.

It should be noted that this policy applies to the FIVB Wild Card and not the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Wild Card which is determined by the promoter of the respective event.

VC Beach Local Organizing Committee (LOC) Wild Card Process

LOC Wildcards are considered promotional wild cards and can be assigned at the discretion of the LOC. LOC Wildcards to events outside of Canada will be made by the local LOC and without the involvement of Volleyball Canada. For Canadian Beach Pro Tour events, the LOC may request Volleyball Canada to nominate the teams for LOC wildcards. When this is the case Volleyball Canada will use the same process as used for FIVB wildcards to nominate teams for main draw LOC wild cards. That is the team with the highest FIVB entry points and not in the main draw of the upcoming event. The same process may be used for LOC qualification wildcards; however, Volleyball Canada reserves the right to nominate these wildcards at their discretion and based upon developmental rationale. Volleyball Canada will not nominate two LOC wild cards to the same team within the same year.

2026 FIVB Beach Volleyball Sport Regulations (TBC)

Entry and Seeding

- **Entry and Seeding Points**
 - Entry Points = **Best 3 of last 4** Beach Pro Tour & WCH finishes within 365 days at **-28 days**
 - Seeding Points = **Best 3 of last 4** Beach Pro Tour & WCH finishes within 365 days at:
 - Elite: **-14 Days** and **reseeded if withdraws are after -14 days**
 - Challenge and Futures: Date of Preliminary Inquiry (**-1 day**)

Competition Format

- **Elite**
 - 16-Team Main Draw (4 Pools of 4 with **full pool play**) + 16-team Qualification to qualify **4 teams**

- **Top 3** in each pool advance to playoffs (1st place to Quarterfinals, 2nd/3rd place in Round of 12)
- Or
- 24-Team Main Draw (6 Pools of 4 with **full pool play**) + 16-team Qualification to qualify **8 teams**
- **Olympic Format** – Top 2 in each pool + the 2 best 3rd place teams advance to the Round of 16 playoffs. The 4 worst 3rd place teams play in **2 lucky loser** matches with the 2 winners joining the Round of 16 playoffs.
- **Challenge**
 - 32-team Main Draw (8 Pools of 4 with **modified pool play**) 32-team Qualification to qualify **8 teams**
 - **Top 3** in each pool advance to playoffs (1st Place to Round of 16, 2nd/3rd Place in Round of 24)
- **Futures**
 - 16 Main Draw Teams (4 Pools of 4 with **modified pool play**) 16-team Qualification to qualify **4 teams**
 - **Top 3** in each pool advance to 12-team single elimination

FIVB Policy Extended Absence Due to Maternity Leave

- VC must submit a birth certificate and declare a return to play event at least **35 days** before the event
- Athlete must return within 2 years of birth:
 - **FIVB Entry Ranking** after the last tournament played before maternity leave is **preserved** upon return, so the **Starting Total** equals the FIVB Entry Points necessary to maintain the same FIVB Entry Ranking
- First event upon return will count in best 3 of 4 events if beneficial only
- **Starting Total** is decreased by 1/3 after each additional event participation
- After 4 events the Starting Total is zero
- Maternity Benefit lasts for 1 year after return

FIVB Policy Extended Absence Due to Serious Injury

- VC must submit a valid medical certificate at least **35 days** before the event showing that the athlete was not able to play for at least **12 months**
- Athlete must return within 2 years from the date of the injury:
 - **FIVB Entry Ranking** after the last tournament played before serious injury is **preserved** upon return, so the **Starting Total** equals the FIVB Entry Points necessary to maintain the same FIVB Entry Ranking
- **Starting Total** is decreased by 1/3 after each additional event participation
- After 3 events the Starting Total is zero
- Serious Injury Benefit lasts for 1 year after return

10. NORCECA Beach Tour and VC NORCECA Selection Policy

NORCECA Beach Tour – Important Considerations

Athletes should always travel to NORCECA Beach Tour Events with matching player tops with **#1 / #2 and CAN** on the tops. **NORCECA will not allow players to play if they don't have matching player tops with #1/#2 and Country Code (CAN)**

At NORCECA Events the hotel and food are covered from Thursday evening until Monday morning. Any additional hotel nights are the responsibility of the players concerned. Usually, the CAN2 team will be required to pay for their hotel and food costs from Thursday night to Sunday night. For the 2026 season, VC will pay the **\$500 USD** NORCECA registration fee for all Canadian teams.

NORCECA Selection Policy

Selecting Canadian Teams for 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour Events

Volleyball Canada (VC) is only **guaranteed one (1) berth** in each gender of a 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour event. If there is space, then VC can also receive a 2nd berth to 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour events (VC is informed of this 2nd berth less than 14 days before the NORCECA Beach Tour event).

Since NORCECA Beach Tour events are a primary pathway for new teams with zero FIVB points to gain entry into FIVB events and since the access to NORCECA events is so limited versus FIVB events (1 maybe 2 CAN teams at NORCECA events versus multiple CAN teams at FIVB events), VC must ensure that teams with substantial FIVB points do not compete in the majority of NORCECA events because they will effectively block the pathway to the FIVB for new teams.

Below is the 2026 VC NORCECA Selection Policy used to determine the registration by VC of Canadian teams into the 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour events:

2026 NORCECA Selection Policy

- In order to register for a NORCECA Event both players on a team must be medically cleared to play
- FIVB Entry Points are calculated at **-33 days** prior to any NORCECA Beach Tour Event
- Teams with **1200+ FIVB Entry Points** will not be permitted to enter into 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour events.
Exception:
 - Entry in the following 2026 NORCECA events will be determined **by FIVB Entry Points** (no limit):
 - The 1st 2026 NORCECA Event plus any 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour Event organized in Canada
 - The 2026 NORCECA Championships (Finals) – LA 2028 Olympic Qualification event
 - VC will register teams on the 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour (Except teams above) by the VC NORCECA Trials System below:
 - VC Trials (All):
 - Teams with **1,200+ FIVB Entry Points** will not be permitted to participate in NORCECA Trials
 - The 2nd and 3rd place teams will play a match after the gold and bronze matches to determine the actual 2nd ranked team **if the 2nd and 3rd ranked teams have not played** each other in the Trials. Otherwise, the result of their most recent match (A playoff match supersedes a pool play match) in the Trials will determine the 2nd ranked team.
 - VC Closed NORCECA Trials - Indoor at the VC Beach HP Centre at Downsview (Feb/Mar 2026)
 - At least one player on each competing team must be a 2026 National Team Member (16-team maximum per gender) or earned FIVB points in 2023.
 - **For entry into NORCECA events up to July 2026**
 - VC Open NORCECA Trials May/June/July 2026 (At Ashbridges Bay, Toronto)
 - Open entry to any Canadian citizen (32 Team maximum per gender)
 - **For entry into NORCECA events starting in August 2026**
 - These VC NORCECA Trials will determine a final ranking of 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th and these **4 teams** will comprise the updated **VC NORCECA Eligibility List**.
 - Teams which finish below 4th place will not earn a spot on the latest VC NORCECA Eligibility List
 - Teams will be offered entry based on their position in the VC NORCECA Eligibility List
 - If no team accepts from the VC NORCECA Eligibility List of 4 teams, VC reserves the right to either hold additional NORCECA Trials or name the team directly. This decision is at the discretion of the Beach High Performance Director in consultation with Next Gen Coaches.
 - The 1st place team will be offered their choice of which is their first NORCECA event they plan to participate in. If the 1st place team from a NORCECA Trials selects the second, third or fourth NORCECA event then the CANADA 1 team that plays in the event proceeding the event selected by the 1st place NORCECA Trials team will be moved to CANADA 2 for that selected event.
 - Teams will be offered entry into one NORCECA event-and must average a medal finish over **2 events (Maximum total of 2 finishes is 6)** to earn another NORCECA nomination otherwise the next team on the VC NORCECA Eligibility List will be offered entry. For example, **a team must finish 5th at their first NORCECA event in order to be registered at a second tournament. If a team finishes 6th or worse at their first event, they are removed from participating in NORCECA events and the next team in the VC NORCECA Eligibility List will be offered entry into the next NORCECA event.**
 - NORCECA results from June 2026 and earlier do not carry over past June 2026 with respect to this policy.

Volleyball Canada Beach National Team Handbook

- A team will be offered an automatic second NORCECA event, regardless of that team's performance at the first event, if the second NORCECA event is the next weekend after the first event.
- Where NORCECA requires confirmed travel in advance of an event concluding (and therefore before results are known), and where events are scheduled such that selection cannot occur after the preceding event, the team entered in the first event will be assigned to subsequent event(s) within that sequence. This applies where travel timelines prevent selection decisions being made after the completion of the preceding event.
- A Player may be replaced due to injury (With the new team keeping the NORCECA Berth) once in 2026 provided:
 - The injury occurs within 7 days of the NORCECA event, and
 - The injured player shows proof of purchase of an airline ticket to this NORCECA Event
 - The injured player will be withdrawn from any future NORCECA event they are already registered for
 - The injured player must be medically cleared before being allowed to register for a future NORCECA event
- In the event of a force majeure (Where no team in the VC NORCECA Eligibility List agrees to participate), VC reserves the right to nominate any team to ensure that two Canadian teams are registered to compete in each gender at every 2026 NORCECA Beach Tour event.
- All teams which accept NORCECA nominations must provide proof of purchased flights for both players by -14 days before the start of the NORCECA event they have committed to participating in. Volleyball Canada reserves the right to transfer the NORCECA nomination to another team if proof of purchased flights is not provided at -14 days.
