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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

At the 2008 AGM, I had the unpleasant task of informing the membership that Volleyball Canada was near financial insolvency, and that we had developed and initiated a Debt Reduction Plan which would impact all our programs for at least thirty months. Since that time, we have reduced that debt significantly, and have also reviewed and reformed many operational protocols. In addition to those financial and operational reforms, we have also revised our Strategic Plan to 2012 and rededicated ourselves to our core business.

At the end of last year's AGM, we focused our Strategic Plan around the theme of "volleyball in Canada." What this means is that the business of Volleyball Canada is to grow and enhance what is good for volleyball nationally over the long-term. It will be the responsibility of our PTA partners to deliver those programs which have an impact within their own regions. An example of this theme working for everyone is the development of a new membership policy. Volleyball Canada cannot directly grow the membership of any individual province or territory. However, a clear and effective national membership policy will provide every PTA with the opportunity to increase their membership numbers. Remember that a cornerstone of our present policy is that every member of a PTA is a member of Volleyball Canada and vice versa.

As our financial situation improves and as we continue to rebuild our capacity, we will continue to build on the successes which have taken place over the past year. As you all probably know, both our indoor teams qualified for the 2010 World Championships. We have also begun to rebuild our Beach Volleyball Program with the hiring of a National Team Coach, and the establishment of a Beach Volleyball Centre in Toronto. Our Sitting Volleyball program, both men and women have a training centre in Calgary and have competed in the Parapan AM Championships. The men's and women's teams have qualified for the World Championships.

Our national championships continue to attract a record number of teams and we are now committed to hosting a mega event in Toronto in 2012. In May of 2012, we will host all our national championships in one site. This event will not only enhance what has consistently been one of our most successful programs, it will contribute to that other core business: increasing the visibility of volleyball in Canada.

We have begun to explore the development of "sports schools" as an element of athlete development. Currently, two pilot projects are underway, one in Calgary and one in Richmond. These "Centres of Excellence" are consistent with LTAD principles and we hope that a series of these centres will help produce the type of athlete we need to compete internationally.

As we rebuild our domestic capacity, we are also asserting our presence in national and international bodies. Our participation in the Sports Team Coalition has already resulted in some gains in funding. As our finances improve, we are again able to send more delegates to NORCEA and FIVB commissions and meetings. This level of involvement will eventually pay dividends for our National Teams.

On the other hand, we have also had some disappointments. The NRS was launched after some delay. Unfortunately, it was not the seamless, flawless system we were hoping for. Much work remains before it can deliver the services we expect. However, it is being fixed and we can expect an improved system shortly.

In closing, I would like to thank my fellow Board Members, all our staff and the thousands of volunteers for their tireless efforts in making volleyball in Canada better. The work of advancing volleyball in Canada is never-ending and we are fortunate that we have so many people who selflessly meet that challenge day in and day out.

YEAR IN REVIEW

BEACH HIGH PERFORMANCE COMMITTEE

Beach National Team Program and National Beach Volleyball Practice Centre (NBVPC)



After hiring a fulltime Head Coach (Lennard Krapp), a fulltime Beach Development Coach (Angie Shen) and a fulltime admin staff (Rob Dyba), Volleyball Canada established a three-way partnership in order to run a fulltime National Beach Volleyball Practice Centre in Toronto. The partners Ontario Volleyball Association, Canadian Sport Centre Ontario and Volleyball Canada are contributing to a centre that is serving all development levels with year round quality coaching in order to meet World standards.

Due to the bold goals of the program, the talent & commitment of the athletes, quality of the staff, the commitment of the partners and the already established support system, the centre is eligible to receive Ontario High Performance Sport Initiative Funding. These financial resources will allow for hiring a second fulltime Beach Development Coach. The targeted group of athletes will be expected to own the podium in 2015 (Pan Am Games in Toronto) and 2016 (Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro), which is also the focus of the current National Team Program. A future high performance advisory group, together with the Head Coach, will create a staged plan in order to achieve these objectives and build a sustainable support system.

The transition has not been without its bumps. The culture change, to year round high performance beach programs and a National Federation taking the lead on the development and support of National Team athletes still has to be established.

Further challenges are the loss of 2 senior cards per gender (5 remaining), no travel funding for the athletes, high indoor beach court fees and appeals.

Volleyball Canada and Volleyball BC started bridging the Centre in the East with the Provincial Associations in the West by organizing a selection camp in Vancouver in May 2010 for U19 and U21 World Championships as well as for T2C.

It should be noted that there the Beach Development Committee (BDC) did not run any activities in the last programming year.

MEN'S INDOOR HIGH PERFORMANCE COMMITTEE

The Men's Indoor National Team just finished its first year in Gatineau. The highlight of the year was without a doubt the qualification into the World Championships to be held later this year in Italy, secured by a first place finish at the Norceca qualifying tournament last August in Mexico. More recently, the team finally made the physical move into its new home, the Centre Sportif, where the 2010 Open Selection camp took place from May 9 to 14 with approximately 45 athletes participating. Another positive point for the long-term development of the program was the operation of the Full-Time Training Centre this past fall and winter. A total of 13 athletes trained with Vincent Pichette, while Glenn Hoag was busy leading the Slovenian team of ACH Bled to a European Champions' League Final 4 appearance in early May.

It will no doubt be a very busy summer and fall for the Men's program. The A team will be preparing for the World Championships, starting on September 25th in Italy. The B team will be training for 6 weeks to prepare a group of athletes for the 2011 World University Games as well as to identify and begin preparations for longer term success in the 2013-2016 quadrennial. Volleyball Canada will also be operating a Junior team, to participate in the NORCECA Championships held August 14 to 22 in Gatineau.

WOMEN'S INDOOR HIGH PERFORMANCE COMMITTEE

Head Coach Arnd (Lupo) Ludwig had a successful 1st year at the helm of our Senior Women's team. The highlight of the year was without a doubt the qualification into the World Championships to be held later this year in Japan, secured by a first place finish at the NORCECA qualifying tournament last August in Mexico.

The spring of 2010 saw the hiring of Scott Koskie as full-time Assistant coach with the senior A team. Scott is a former Team Canada setter and captain (1995-2008). Scott's international experience will undoubtedly benefit the team.

A few positive points for the long-term development of the program: 1- the operation of the Full-time Training Center this past winter. A total of 6 athletes trained with Lupo in preparation for the upcoming spring and summer season; 2- TCWV is operating a B team for 12 weeks to prepare a group of athletes for the 2011 World University Games as well as to identify and begin preparations for longer term success in the 2013-2016 quadrennial.

DISABLED VOLLEYBALL COMMITTEE

The past year has brought a lot of change and renewal to the disabled volleyball program. The departure of Phil Alan last summer, the longest serving staff person at VC at that time, was a tremendous loss for the program, however from this loss came great opportunity. In the fall VC hired Kerry MacDonald as a part time coordinator for the program and started the process of reestablishing the Canadian program as a world leader in volleyball for the disabled.

Sitting Volleyball

The search for the right coaches began in the late fall and concluded in January with the official naming of Larry Matthews as the women’s sitting team head coach and Ian Halliday as the men’s sitting team head coach. Kerry also hired Anne Fleming as the teams’ physiotherapist.

The program also continued to recruit athletes to both teams. The women added four new athletes while the men added one. This brings the women’s program to 10 athletes on their competition roster with 3 more on the training roster. The men now have 11 athletes on their competition roster with 2 more on the training roster.

Although the teams had continued to train in the fall with the committee chair and Larry Matthews as interim coaches, official training camps with the new coaching staff in place started in January. The team started training by-monthly in preparation for the Pan-American Championships in Colorado in March. The experience gained by the two young teams at the qualifying event was invaluable as they both finished with bronze medals. With the announcement by WOVD that men’s and women’s teams from Canada would both be granted wild card bids for the World championship, the team training schedule was set to include 4 camps prior to Worlds.





A very successful showcase training camp was held at the 15U/16U Western Canadian Open with the sitting volleyball court taking center stage at the entrance to the Olympic oval. Athletes from both disabled teams and the women's senior team were able to meet at a reception and played some sitting volleyball together following an autograph session. The publicity and awareness within the volleyball community gained by the sitting program was immense. A special note of thanks to the University of Calgary, the Alberta Volleyball association and the entire organizing committee at the Western Canadian Open. With their support, the national disabled program is now better prepared to represent Volleyball Canada at the upcoming World Championship. The leadership and vision exhibited by the AVA and the U of C is a great example of how cooperation and sharing of facilities and resources can work to better the greater volleyball community in Canada.

The program then worked with the City of Surrey BC to run a training camp in conjunction with a showcase for the disabled community in the lower mainland. The City of Surrey used this opportunity to gain some exposure for a league that they have now established within the community.

DOMESTIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

2009-2010 saw the DDC very active in communicating with the Canada Games Council in dealing with the review of the athletes' ages at the 2013 Canada Games in Sherbrooke.

In addition, the committee is monitoring several initiatives, including:

LTAD Implementation

The main LTAD implementation initiatives the DDC focused on in 2009-2010 are:

- Monitoring the use of Triple ball (13U competition) in targeted provinces (ON, AB, SK).
- Tracking feedback from new 18U over-aged high school athletes rule
- New NTCC concept finalized – tied in with Junior National Team program (18U/19U). The Men's event in Toronto (July 21-26) will serve as ID/selection for our Junior National Team.
- Extra Sport Canada funding enabled VC to hire a full-time Sport School coordinator. His mandate was to develop a plan of action for VC to partner with targeted groups across the country to set-up Sport Schools (Sport Academies). Currently in discussion with local groups in Vancouver and Calgary.
- Clubmark program moved forward. Currently in final stage of development. Should be launched in September 2010
- Updated LTAD Power Point presentation uploaded on the VC website.

Coaching

- Indoor/Beach NCCP working group meeting March 17-19, 2010 in Toronto. Our Level 3 program was reviewed and revised.
- Level 1 expected to complete the Coaching Association of Canada's (CAC) Final Approval Process in early June. Level 2 will be re-submitted for Conditional Approval with the CAC upon receiving Final Approval from the CAC.
- New web site (via Dartfish TV) under development for coaches. The site will feature technical video clips to aid coaches in understanding correct execution and improve error detection and correction skills.
- The Level 1 manual is currently being updated. This is an update and not a full rewrite. The manual will be given an updated look with a new layout and updated photos. Seven chapters will be updated this spring/summer to reflect current

technical understanding and rule changes that have occurred over the past 15 years. The remaining chapters in the manual will be revised next spring.

Mini/Atomic

As part of the expected evolution Volleyball Canada operated a successful P/TA grant program:

- Funding provided for the operation of grassroots community outreach programs
- 5 PSOs received funding (BC, AB, PEI, SK, QC)
- 22,058 people participated in program
- Have applied for additional funding to operate the program again in 2010-11

DOMESTIC COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE

The 2009-2010 season has been an exciting year for the DCC. 712 teams participated in the four 2009 Canadian Open Youth Championships, increasing slightly from the previous year. The DCC ran the 13U category pilot for a second year, which saw 20 teams participating. The tournament was hosted in conjunction with the 14U West Open, however for the second year in a row the 13U boys category was cancelled due to lack of registration. The pilot will be re-evaluated at the next DCC annual meeting. The DCC also had to cancel the 15U boys East Open due to lack of participation. This category will also be re-evaluated.

After selection of the 2010-2011 hosts, the DCC hosted them for a workshop in November, where the Event Hosting Manual was explained, best practices were exchanged between groups and Iset training also occurred.

Finally, after the feasibility study completed in early 2009, the DCC sent our RFPs for the 2012 Canadian Open. In September of 2009, the city of Toronto was selected to host this prestigious event. Since then, the DCC has been working closely with the city of Toronto and hopes to announce officially to all its members by September 2010.

BEACH COMPETITIONS COMMITTEE

The 2009 Beach Volleyball National Championships were hosted by the Ontario Volleyball Association at Ashbridges Bay - 280 teams in 14 categories, from 11 provinces and territories participated. This is consistent with registration numbers in the previous 2 years of the 'open' model.

This year the BCC is in the process of implementing a new hosting model. It studied the Indoor hosting model and adjusted it to beach volleyball's needs.

The BCC is working on a bidding document for this new model for hosting of the 2011-2012 Beach Volleyball National Championships and plans on releasing the document mid 2010.

In addition, the committee is working on the framework to restart a National Tour; on a small scale at first with hopes of a larger sustainable model over time.
